ASPEN – A new program gives local high school physics students a chance to interview world-renowned physicists.

The fourth Radio Physics program airs at 4:30 p.m. Tuesday on KDNK. Aspen High School students Caroline Boyd, Zach Kendrick and Joe Kistner will discuss biophysics.
